
#### sQuid and MCAS

Further to our letter that went out on Thursday 27 February, a quick reminder of key details below:

- sQuid will continue to be used up until end of lunch service on **Thursday 6 March** (please ensure your child has sufficient funds in their account to purchase food / drink in school). If you have an outstanding sQuid balance at this point please **Request a Balance Withdrawal For This Purse** via your sQuid App.
- From the start of the day on **Friday 7 March** the switch will have been made to My Child At School (MCAS). Please ensure that you have registered for the My Child At School (MCAS) service. If you have not completed this, please log in, input your password then select Reset Password. Once you have access you will be able to top from here. See guide <a href="here">here</a> for MCAS Desktop option or <a href="here">here</a> for MCAS app users.

We would like to make you aware that the student ID cards are attached to the student, not sQuid, so will transfer across to the new MCAS system automatically.

A reminder that students must have their card to purchase food/drink in school. Students will not be able to purchase food/drink in school unless they have their student card with them.

#### Ski Trip

From 14 to 20 February 2025, 53 students embarked on an unforgettable ski trip to the town of Flirsch, which was only a twenty minute bus ride to the main resort of St Anton.

The first day on the slopes was met with enthusiasm and incredible progress. Advanced groups wasted no time, tackling the challenging terrains straight up the mountain, covering at least seven different lifts in two hours. By day three, all beginner groups were up in the mountains tackling chair lifts and gondolas. A particular highlight was when the advanced groups managed to ski into the next valley and across the valley up to Rendlbahn, with stunning scenery and views across the Tyrol region of Austria. The glorious weather conditions throughout the week made St Anton even more picturesque. On the final day, the progression made by all skiers was evident with parallel turns, one leg skiing and jumps to conclude the week's skiing.

Our students not only displayed their skiing ability but also exceptional behaviour throughout the trip. Their conduct was a true testament to the values of our school; students were also extremely supportive of each other, offering moments of encouragement and praise to keep morale high even when the skiing might have been tougher than expected. It was fantastic to see the camaraderie between all students as students made new friends from outside their own year group. The trip was full of amazing memories and unforgettable experiences.
