We aim to instill a love of learning in our students, intellectual curiosity and a thirst for knowledge. Academic disciplines are taught as discrete subjects by specialist teachers. Classroom-based learning is enhanced through a wide variety of enjoyable and memorable extra-curricular opportunities, experiences and visits.

The curriculum we offer is key to the delivery of our school vision - enabling everyone to thrive. We recognise not only that academic qualifications open doors for our students, but also the importance of our young people developing the skills, confidence and character to lead successful personal and professional lives.

Our curriculum is broad, balanced and ambitious. It embraces academic and creative rigour. For example:

- KS3 students study two languages
- All KS3 students study Dance
- All KS3 students undertake a rotating curriculum including Visual Arts, Textiles and Food Technology.



Key Stage 3

Students follow a three year curriculum in Key Stage 3. Students are taught in mixed ability groups in all subjects with the exception of Science and Maths, which are taught in ability groupings, based initially on KS2 SATs results.

We strive to provide academic challenge and support tailored to individual students and regularly monitor progress.

Students study two of three modern foreign languages (French, German and Spanish).



In addition to the core subjects of English, Mathematics, Physical Education and Sciences, KS4 options are chosen. These are designed to provide a GCSE programme whereby the core is enriched by a choice of subjects including ICT, Modern Foreign Languages, the Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences. We offer advice and guidance to all students to determine the most appropriate GCSE options for them.

Our work related curriculum, which involves careers education, enterprise education and work experience, prepares students for the world of work and is an integral part of our curriculum.

ENGLISH





The English department at Langley Park School for Girls prides itself on offering a rich and varied curriculum which sparks intellectual curiosity and develops students as life-long learners. While we understand that literacy is the key that opens all the other doors in education, we also believe that encouraging our students' creative potential will enable them to become imaginative, informed and independent thinkers and learners. Our lessons are engaging and enjoyable; fun-filled, they also challenge and levels encourage high of accomplishment.

We believe that the right book has the power to take a student on an emotionally rich journey, transport them in that moment beyond their own world and change forever how they see themselves and others. Across the age range, we explore a wealth of fiction, drama, poetry and non-fiction including literature from the literary canon, world literature and non-literary texts such as newspaper articles and speeches. Our aim is to develop students' understanding of universal themes and ideas and to promote an appreciation of literary traditions.

We encourage confident self-expression in our students. Through both written and oral tasks we promote tolerance, recognising and valuing the opinion of others, and students' awareness and understanding of the world around them. We promote critical thinking throughout our teaching and actively encourage students to challenge established and traditional readings of texts, even the established traditional readings of their teachers!

The range of texts chosen is as broad as the range of the backgrounds of our students and staff.

MATHS

In the Mathematics department at Langley Park School for Girls, we encourage students to develop a real enjoyment and understanding of this beautiful subject.

Students are set by ability, with lessons following a variety of formats. We aim to offer our students opportunities for choice, challenge and collaboration, which is facilitated by working on the walls as well as on paper!

We build on the achievements and experiences of the primary curriculum and support students in the transition from primary to secondary school mathematics. Class sizes vary according to ability with setting taking place at the start of Year 7. Setting is reviewed regularly and changes made where it is felt necessary.

All students at LPGS sit Maths GCSE. In addition, the highest ability Year 11 students sit the AQA Level 2 certificate in Further Maths and the Entry Level Certificate is offered to selected students for whom it is suitable.





Key Stage 5 students may opt to study Maths or Further Maths at A-Level. It is regarded favourably by universities and employers and is a subject which leads to a long list of career prospects and distinguishes our students from other prospective applicants.

S C I E N C E







Science at Key Stage 3

We believe that Science provides an opportunity to develop an understanding of the concepts and processes that describe the world around us, and can lead to diverse and dynamic choices for future study and careers.

We deliver an exciting spiral curriculum, in which skills and knowledge are developed in strands which feed into our GCSE programme of study. Students are empowered to develop their memory and recall through frequent links to prior learning. Practical, investigative, analytical and evaluative skills are interwoven with theory, thereby promoting the development of a sound and thorough understanding of the key concepts required for success in Science.

Assessment via topic tests at the end of each strand has the twofold aim of developing strong retrieval of core facts, as well as the application of knowledge through extended writing, calculation practice and analysis. During the course of each year, students develop their scientific enquiry skills through planning, undertaking and evaluating a full practical investigation.



Medics Programme

Our most able scientists are encouraged to consider a future in medicine. We have a programme of talks and visits to support this decision making process and ultimately their applications. This is run by Dr. Jennings, a former trauma surgical consultant.

Science at Key Stage 4

At GCSE, most students study Combined Science (AOA); a double award GCSE suitable for all abilities and covering a wide range of topics in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Students are opportunity to select Triple Science as an option during Years 10 and 11. leads to separate GCSE This qualifications in Biology, Chemistry and Physics, covering a wider array of topics and providing a very thorough preparation for A-Levels in Science subjects. For our GCSE are assessed students courses, through formal examinations at the end of Year 11. Students also undertake a number practicals, as well as getting plenty of opportunities to develop investigative skills through further experimental work.

Science at Key Stage 5

We offer A-Level courses in Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Psychology, as well as vocational courses in Applied Science and Human Biology. We place a high value on personalising the support that we offer to our students at this level, and aim to combine this with lessons and enrichment activities aimed at developing the independent learning skills that students will need as they move on from LPGS.

MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES *French, German and Spanish*



The Modern Foreign Languages Department aims to promote an enthusiasm for life-long language learning and develops students' awareness of the importance of languages in today's society, whilst our curriculum develops their resilience and enthusiasm for learning beyond the immediate exam requirements.

We strongly believe in the value of educational visits and extra-curricular activities as a way of engaging students with the wider cultural benefits of language learning.

There is an excellent range of opportunities available for students. Our Foreign Language Assistants run a weekly Language club, Eurolab. This is open to all year groups. We offer a range of enrichment languages which involve trips as well as language lessons. There are also foreign film clubs and visits abroad.

All students learn two languages from Year 7. Lessons have a strong focus on communication skills and spontaneous language use as well as cultural learning through authentic materials and film.

The languages offered are French, German and Spanish.





VISUAL ARTS Fashion & Textiles, Fine Art, Photography and Creative Digital Media

At Key Stage 3, all students study a broad course in the Visual Arts. Project work covers aspects of Fine Art, such as drawing, painting, sculpture and print making. Students also work in Textiles and Creative Digital Media.

At Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5, students elect to study specialist subject areas in greater depth leading to a more tailored experience in their chosen areas of study. At both GCSE and A-Level, students are able to specialise in Fine Art, Textiles or Photography and at Key Stage 5; we also offer vocational courses in Art and Design and Digital Creative Media.

The Visual Arts provide opportunity for personal expression and encourage imagination, sensitivity, conceptual thinking, powers of observation, analytical abilities and foster practical skills.

The curriculum affords students opportunities for personal development through a variety of programmes of study in the Visual Arts.

Students are taught by an enthusiastic and hard-working team of highly-qualified staff within mixed ability teaching groups. Programmes of study at Key Stages 3, 4 and 5 promote differentiation to meet individual needs. High quality outcomes are consistently promoted and achieved across the department. Each year many of our young artists secure places at well regarded universities and colleges in the Arts, which is supported by our partnership with the University of Creative Arts.





HUMANITIES







Geography

Geography is a rigorous and wide ranging academic discipline drawing on many aspects of the sciences, economics, mathematics and sociology. Data collection/response and interpretation is an integral part of our work and students learn how to hypothesise and evaluate key management issues.

All students studying Geography have the opportunity to engage with fieldwork. These include local day trips to Brighton and London, UK based residentials to Dorset and trips abroad to places such as Iceland, Naples and Barcelona.

In Key Stage 3 we explore natural and human processes of change and how they shape the planet we live on, building a sense of global wonder. Topics include globalisation, polar environments and emerging India.

The subject lends itself to any career involving decision-making, for example engineering, the Civil Service, and tourism. It is also an excellent preparation for Higher Education or direct entry into employment because of its contemporary and holistic nature and its practical emphasis on decision-making and research. Through Geography, students understand the way in which our planet is changing and what we can do to protect it.



It is hoped that, through a study of religion, philosophy and ethics, students will broaden their knowledge of religious beliefs, teaching and practices, which will assist in further developing cultural capital and deepening community cohesion.

History

Our Key Stage 3 curriculum is based on the use of enquiry questions within lessons and across a series of lessons so that students can engage with the past and reach their own conclusions. At a glance, the curriculum provides students with an understanding of the history of Britain and the World from the Middle Ages until the present day.

For GCSE, students follow the AQA History specification. The course allows for the development of the historical skills already acquired in Years 7-9. The content builds on some of the work done at Key Stage 3 including The Tudors in Year 8 and the Twentieth Century in Year 9. However, it also includes a number of exciting new topics such as Medicine Through Time and an in-depth study of life in the USA. Our taught curriculum includes both national and international history as well as study of the historical environment.

At A-Level, students study world history, including Russia, the USA and South Africa.

Religious Studies

The Religious Studies department plays a contributing role in our students' spiritual, moral, social, cultural and intellectual development. Our curriculum has been developed with our students' progress and achievement at its core. Students are given opportunities to explore who they are in the context of the world around them.

They are challenged to build their knowledge base whilst applying key skills such as critical thinking, enquiry, justification, evaluation, synthesis and dialogue.

PERFORMING ARTS



Dance

The Dance department champions the development of our students' creativity, innovation, confidence, resilience and independence through dance.

Dance is studied throughout all key stages and develops our students' physical, technical and performance skills through a range of stimuli.

Students experience a diverse range of styles including Contemporary, Traditional African Dance, Ballet and Hip Hop, whilst exploring and experimenting with choreography to hone their individual performance style.

We have a beautiful dance studio space where we work within a positive learning environment. Students are expected to support each other, working effectively on their own, and as part of a team.

We ask our students to fully immerse themselves within the dance culture at LPGS through our extensive extra-curricular programme including: our in-house Contemporary Dance Companies; 'Common Ground' our partnership Dance Company with Langley Park School for Boys; ' Line-up' Dance Company specialising in Hip Hop and diverse styles and our student led Key Stage 3 Dance Company.

Students enjoy many opportunities to develop their presentation skills. These include our annual dance performance 'The Mix-tape', being guest performers in our neighbouring schools' productions, competing in local dance competitions, attending professional dance workshops and attending the dance theatre.

Drama

Drama at LPGS focuses on the ethos of a team spirit, personal reflection, and the development of empathy and awareness of others. Students are introduced to a range of skills at Key Stage 3 in conjunction with themes of differing social and historical contexts.

Those students choosing to take Drama at GCSE will develop an appreciation for analysing play texts, improving their performance skills and written evaluative ability. At A-Level, students benefit from the experience of specialist practitioners and are taken to see a broad range of theatre styles.

At every level at LPGS we encourage autonomy and independence, allowing students the confidence to explore their creativity. We are fortunate to have links with esteemed theatre companies such as Complicité, Gecko and Splendid Theatre.

On an annual basis the Performing Arts faculty join forces to produce the ever-popular whole school musical. Specialist workshops are held before school and at lunchtime for students to refine their skills.

Drama is an integral part of students' development, fostering effective communication and teamwork skills.

Music

The Music department at LPGS is an ever evolving, vibrant and dynamic department that inspires students to express and develop their creative ideas. Music is offered at every key stage, with our examination results at GCSE and A-Level consistently placing us among the school's highest-achieving subjects.

The achievements of our students are celebrated each term through school concerts and wider community events.

The extra-curricular programme is rich and varied and driven by the interests and abilities of the students. Music Production and DJing are now part of the offer. There are choirs to suit all vocal styles, orchestras and concert bands for instrumentalists that suitably challenge students of Grade 1 through to Grade 8. There are opportunities to play in small chamber groups such as the Chamber Orchestra, Flute Ensemble and Trumpet Ensemble.

The most committed students can become part of the Tour Band which has performed all over Europe in Spain, Poland, France and Slovakia, as well as in China.

All students in Year 7 learn a musical instrument and perform as part of their curriculum experience. Students learn either keyboard, violin, trombone or clarinet. Instruments are provided for students.

Physical Education

Physical Education makes a valuable contribution to the education of every student at LPGS. It is unique in the way that students learn and refine new skills, either individually in aroups, through or appreciation of how the body works and adapts to new situations. Such knowledge is obtained not only through participation, through observing and analysing the development of oneself and others. Through a sound knowledge base, students are encouraged to plan safe and effective exercise programmes to promote healthy lifestyles for the future.

At Key Stage 4, students choose between the following pathways: Creative, Strategic (games) and Individual.

We also offer the opportunity for students to represent the school in a range of extra-curricular teams and competitions in numerous sports.

LEARNING AND ENJOYING *the wider life of school*

Extra-curricular activities are an essential part of our students' development. A wide range of clubs and activities take place before, during or after the school day, including Feminist Society, Coding Club, Meditation, Sport and Music clubs.

Many students participate in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. Our orchestra, bands and choirs are large and thriving. Residentials, both in this country and abroad, include international sport tours, music and ski trips.

Our links with schools in France, Germany and Tenerife underline our students' sense of themselves as global citizens. In recent years our students have also travelled to Washington, Cambodia and Italy.









LPGS CAREERS Academy

The LPGS Careers Academy is a unique feature of LPGS. All students from Year 7 use UNIFROG, "complete destinations" platform that enables them to explore everything they need to know about careers, university and apprenticeships. Our careers programme caters for all students, ensuring every one of them gets the individual help they need to work out what they would like to do in the future as well as working out the best pathway for them to achieve their goals.

Students enjoy fortnightly guest speakers who outline their educational and career journey and students can, of course, ask them questions. If students are particularly inspired by a speaker, they can request to be paired with them as a mentor. We currently have small mentor groups running for Year 12 and 13 students in psychology, medicine, dentistry, film, photography, law, teaching, midwifery and nutrition.

As part of the programme, students take part in planned sessions to ensure that when it comes time to leave LPGS, they leave with all of the tools they need to pursue the career of their choice.

These sessions include:

- 1:1 careers guidance interviews with our qualified Careers Advisor
- Work experience in Years 10 and 12
- Options interviews for all Year 9 students
- Mock interview sessions with our Careers Advisor and local employers to prepare students for university, apprenticeship or employment interviews
- Business breakfasts with employers
- Participation in the 10X Challenge careers initiative, run by The Young Enterprise company.
- CV and Cover letter writing
- LinkedIn training, which leads to training on building up a network and using it effectively
- Careers workshops
- Small group mentor sessions for specific careers
- Futures Fair (an event where we host universities, colleges, apprenticeship providers and employers for the students to meet with)
- University trips
- A trip to the UK Universities and Apprentice Show

Work Experience

All students in Years 10 and 12 take part in a week's work experience as part of the curriculum.

Students are encouraged to find their own work experience opportunity following a session where they learn to write an application letter and CV. Our students readily access advice from our Careers Advisor about the different ways they can research and approach prospective employers for work experience placements.

This ensures students leave us with relevant experience in the field within which they wish to work, giving them a distinct advantage at interview.

Students are always encouraged to remember that the doors to our Careers Academy are always open.
